Advertising:

According to EYOF Charter, Rule 15a.

No form of advertising or publicity may appear in any form whatsoever on clothing, accessories or, more generally, on any item of clothing or piece of equipment worn or carried by the delegations during the EYOWF, with the exception of the manufacturer's identification and logo, as stipulated in the rules of the IOC. All violations of the provisions of this clause shall lead to disqualification and the withdrawal of the accreditation of the person concerned.

Transportation:

Organiser will provide shuttle bus service from the Olympic village to the venue. Teams with their own cars should register these in advance during the accreditation process. After arrival, teams will receive parking permissions for their car/cars. Without this permission you will be not able to go to the venue with your car!

Race Office:

in the Olympic village - every day 8:00 - 20:00 Ski Venue Jested - Race Office in the finish area during competitions and official trainings

Presentation:

on the first team captains' meeting in the meeting room in the Olympic Village

Bibs:

after the draw at Team Captains' meetings in the Olympic Village one day before the competition

Medical service:

Organiser will provide emergency medical service during trainings and competitions.

Insurance:

All athletes, officials and members of the National Olympic Committees who attend and participate in the event shall do so at their own risk.

Organising Committee will arrange following insurance:

- Third party liability (personal injuries and damages).
- Basic medical costs and individual accidents (permanent disability, consequential damage).

All NOCs are nevertheless strongly advised to provide for an adequate insurance (travel insurance) policy for all members of their delegations.

The OC accepts no liability for bodily or personal injury, or for property loss or damage incurred by Competitors and Officials.

Other Information:

Starting order for individual events will be made by FIS ICR. Starting order for team event see Annex 1.

Ceremonies:

After each competition there will be a flower ceremony at the venue (best 3 athletes/teams). Medal ceremony (best 3 athletes/teams) will be organised in the Olympic Village – see general programme at www.eyowf2011.cz. Organiser can change the programme according to current weather conditions.

Storage / waxing:

There will be storage/waxing team cabins available for participating NOC teams in Olympic village.



Nations Team Event at EYOWF 2011

Alpine skiing - Nations Team Event at EYOWF 2011

Rules

1. Type of Event

- the race will be conducted as a parallel GS
- · GS gates and flags are to be used

2. Eligibility of the Teams

Teams will be deployed in sequence from the lowest to the largest sum of points for the FIS GS of the two best girls and two best boys from each country. The order of the teams whose athletes at the time of the draw do not have the sufficient number of competitors with GS FIS points will be drawn.

- total team size per Nation is limited to a maximum of 6 competitors
- per Nation and run, 2 girls and 2 boys must start

3. Seeding of the Teams

• 32 Nations will form 16 heats as follows:

Bracket list will be arranged as follows:

Heat 1: Nation 1-32 Heat 9: Nation 3-30 Heat 2: Nation 17-16 Heat 10: Nation 14-19 Heat 3: Nation 9-24 Heat 11: Nation 11-22 Heat 4: Nation 8-25 Heat 12: Nation 6-27 Heat 5: Nation 5-28 Heat 13: Nation 7-26 Heat 6: Nation 12-21 Heat 14: Nation 10-23 Heat 7: Nation 13-20 Heat 15: Nation 15-18 Heat 8: Nation 4-29 Heat 16: Nation 2-31

Ladies will receive bibs from 1 to 3 and Men from 4 to 6, in alphabetical order

4. Running the Competition

Each individual race (leg) between two opponents consists of one run.

The start order will be as follow:

"Course Blue" Nation 1 L1 against "Course Red" Nation 16 L1

"Course Blue" Nation 1 M1 against "Course Red" Nation 16 M1

"Course Red" Nation 1 L2 against "Course Blue" Nation 16 L2

"Course Red" Nation 1 M2 against "Course Blue" Nation 16 M2

The blue course will be located on the skier's right



5. Points Scoring

- The winner of each individual race (leg)scores 1 point for his/her nation
- In case of a tie of an individual race (leg), both nations are awarded
 1 point
- If there is a tie at the end of the heat (2:2) the nation with the lowest combined time of the best individual lady and the best individual man (or second best in case of a tie for the best time) will win the heat.
- If both competitors fall in any race, the first competitor to reach the finish successfully will be the winner. If both competitors fail to finish, the competitor who successfully skied the furthest distance will be the race winner

6. Causes for Disqualifications (immediate and without protest)

- · Changing from one course to another
- Disturbing the opponent, voluntary or non voluntary
- Failure to pass through a gate correctly (ICR art. 661.4.2)
- Turn not executed on the outside of the gate
